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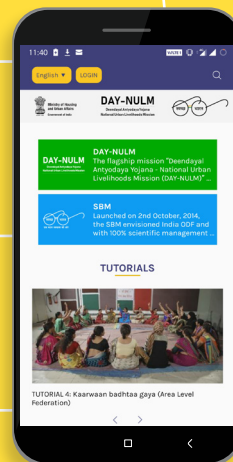

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Snapshot of some of the tutorials

This series of tutorials are different from traditional training videos and has elements of drama and engaging characters that take the viewers through the process of forming of a SHG, opening bank accounts and taking loans for livelihoods. It tells the story of a *basti* with real, relatable women like Ramila, Sushila and Gul. These women discover the strength of coming together as a group and how with the help of DAY-NULM's functionaries, they not only overcome challenges in their personal lives, but are able to resolve issues of their *basti*.



Ek Aur Ek Gyaarah

This tutorial explains the importance and formation of Self Help Groups. Women of the *basti* come together and form the Pragatisheel SHG with the help of CRP-Bhavna.



SHG Ka Bastaa

The second tutorial explains the need and the way to maintain various registers of SHGs. Ramila, the secretary of the SHG learns book-keeping from the CO and CRP.



Ujaalaa

This tutorial explains the advantages of bank linkages & the interest subsidy offered to SHGs. All members of the Pragatisheel SHG open individual bank accounts.



Kaarawaan Badhataa Gayaa

This tutorial introduces the Area Level Federation and highlights the benefits for SHGs to join the ALF. The Pragatisheel SHG members meet their peers from other SHGs and decide to join the ALF.



Saalgirah

In this tutorial, the members of the SHG talk about their stories of change over the year. It shows the strength of the Pragatisheel SHG in improving basic services in the *basti*. In the annual meeting, the SHG also decides to start a business and take a bank loan.

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) is leading a paradigm change in the lives of urban poor through the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM).

The U-Learn e-learning portal aims to build capacities of all functionaries of the DAY-NULM Mission (NMMU, SMMU, CMMU, Community Organisers, Community Resource Persons, Resource Organizations, members of Area Level Federations and Self Help Groups and for elected and executive officials of urban local bodies. The U-Learn portal will also serve as a knowledge portal for NGOs and research organizations working in urban poverty and livelihoods sector.

The DAY-NULM work force is highly mobile and they need a learning solution which they can carry with them. Technology-aided learning can help training the DAY-NULM field teams who are mostly out-of-office.
