ORDER

We have heard the learned Solicitor General as well as Mr.

E.R. Kumar appearing in person. We have also gone through the report.

In our opinion, for the present, there is a need to concentrate on the way forward. For this purpose, we would like the learned Solicitor General to inform us whether the Committees under the National Urban Livelihood Mission are in position in all the States and Union Territories; whether the accounts have been audited from time to time and if not which is the authority that can assist in auditing of accounts such as Comptroller and Auditor General; release of further funds and non-utilization of funds already released. There may be some other issues that may arise and therefore the hearing that will take place on 13.10.2017 should not be construed limited to these issues.

List the matter for final disposal on 13.10.2017 at the end of the Board.

The Registry is directed not to accept any affidavit filed by any State. Whatever affidavits have been filed should be returned to the learned counsel.

Status report (Based on the information furnished by the States/UTs) in compliance of the order dated 13.09.2017 of Hon'ble Supreme Court

Procedure for Release of Central Funds to States/ UTs under DAY-NULM

The audit of the accounts is done by respective States/UTs from time to time as per the provision of GFR. The release of funds to States/UTs for implementation of Centrally Sponsored Scheme, is governed by provisions under General Financial Rules, 2017. As per Rule 236(2) of GFR, 2017, the accounts of all Grantee Institutions or Organisations shall be open to inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG(DPC) Act 1971 and internal audit by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry or Department, whenever the Institution or Organisation is called upon to do so. Further, the Grantee Institutions or Organizations including the State Level Implementing Agency is required to get its accounts audited from Chartered Accountants of its own choice.

Further, as per Rule 238(2) of GFR, 2017 In respect of recurring Grants, Ministry or Department concerned should release any amount sanctioned for the subsequent financial year only after Utilization Certificate in respect of Grants of preceding financial year is submitted. Release of Grants-in- aid in excess of 75 percent of the total amount sanctioned for the subsequent financial year shall be done only after utilisation certificate and the annual audited statement relating to Grants-in- aid released in the preceding year are submitted to the satisfaction of the Ministry/Department concerned.

Grants-in- aid released to States/UTs under DAY-NULM, is subject to provisions of General Financial Rules, 2017. The first instalment of grant-in- aid to a State/UT is released only after provisional Utilization Certificate for grant-in- aid released in the preceding years and Final Utilization Certificate and Annual Audited Statement for the penultimate year, is received. Quantum of the first instalment is limited to 75 percent of grant-in- aid allocated to the State/UT for the financial year. More than 75% of funds allocated can be released only after Final Utilization Certificate and Annual Audited Statement for the preceding financial year is received. This practice ensures that accounts of Implementing Agencies of DAY-NULM, are audited regularly and if auditing is not done, no further grant-in- aid will be released to the defaulting Implementing Agencies.

It would be observed that there are a total of 10 States/ UTs viz. Delhi, Meghalaya, Tripura, Manipur, Maharashtra, Haryana, Mizoram, Bihar, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu which have not furnished audited statements for 2015-16 and none of these have been released any grants during the current year as per provisions of GFR. The UTs of Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu have not started implementation of DAY-NULM. In respect of the remaining eight States/ UTs viz. Delhi, Meghalaya, Tripura, Manipur, Maharashtra, Haryana, Mizoram, Bihar, the Ministry has at the level of Joint Secretary written a letter on 4th October, 2017 (Annexure-I) to their Principal Secretaries (UD) drawing their attention to the Order of Hon'ble Supreme Court and asking them to take immediate action to get the annual accounts of DAY-NULM audited at the earliest and forward the pending audit statements to this Ministry. Further, to expedite the audit, it has been suggested that they may consider requesting the C & AG to conduct it.

Status of Project Sanctioning Committee by States/ UTs

The provision as per Operational Guidelines of Shelter for Urban Homeless are as under:

Para 10: A project Sanction Committee shall be constituted at the State level under the Chairmanship of Principal Secretary/ Secretary in-charge of DAY-NULM with representatives of all concerned departments in the State for consideration and approval of proposals submitted by ULBs/ SULM under this component of NULM. A Representative of the Ministry of Housing and Urban

Affairs shall be a member of this Sanctioning Committee. This Ministry vide letter dated 23.12.2014 (Annexure-II) has authorised HUDCO officer posted in the various regional offices of the State to participate in the meetings of Project Sanction Committee constituted by the States/UTs as Ministry's representative and send its observation/report to the Ministry.

I therefore request you to take immediate action to get the annual accounts of DAY-NULM audited at the earliest and forward the pending audit statements to this Ministry. To expedite the audit, you may consider to request the Comptroller and Auditor General to conduct it.
- 5. Action taken / proposed to be taken on the above, including the time frame within which the audit of accounts under DAY-NULM upto 2016-17 would be completed, may please be intimated to us at the earliest so that the same can be intimated to the Hon'ble Supreme Court accordingly.

Writ Petition (S) (Civil) No. 55/2003 and No.572/2003 with respect to provision of shelters for the urban homeless are being heard by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Vide its Order dated 11.11.2016, Hon'ble Supreme Court had ordered for constitution of a Committee, the scope of which was to cause physical verification of the available shelters, their compliance with the operational guidelines of SUH and also to inquire into the reasons for slow progress in the setting up of shelter homes and in that connection to inquire about the non-utilization and / or diversion/ mis-utilisation of funds allocated for the Scheme for Shelter for Urban Homeless.

2. In its last hearing, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has passed the following order.

"In our opinion, for the present, there is a need to concentrate on the way forward. For this purpose, we would like the learned Solicitor General to inform us whether the Committees under the National Urban Livelihood Mission are in position in all the States and Union Territories; whether the accounts have been audited from time to time and if not which is the authority that can assist in auditing of accounts such as Comptroller and Auditor General; release of further funds and non-utilization of funds already released. There may be some other issues that may arise and therefore the hearing that will take place on 13.10.2017 should not be construed limited to these issues.

List the matter for final disposal on 13.10.2017 at the end of the Board."

3. As per the records available with the Ministry, it has been found that your State has not furnished audit statements in respect of allocations made under DAY-NULM for the years 2015-16 onwards. Furnishing of audit statement is mandatory for further release of funds.

- 4. It may be observed from above that Hon'ble Supreme Court appears to be concerned over non-utilisation of funds by states and not getting the audit of accounts completed on time with respect to funds under DAY-NULM in general and shelters to get for urban homeless in particular. I therefore request you to take immediate action to get the annual accounts of DAY-NULM audited at the earliest and forward the pending audit statements to this Ministry. To expedite the audit, you may consider to request the Comptroller and Auditor General to conduct it.
- 5. Action taken / proposed to be taken on the above, including the time frame within which the audit of accounts under DAY-NULM upto 2016-17 would be completed, may please be intimated to us at the earliest so that the same can be intimated to the Hon'ble Supreme Court accordingly.

Subject: Nomination of representative of Ministry of HUPA in the Project Sanction Committee meetings constituted by the States/UTs for approval of Project proposals submitted by Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) under Scheme of Shelter for Urban Homeless (SUH) component of National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM)-reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer the above mentioned subject and to say that as per the operational guidelines for Scheme of Shelter for Urban Homeless (SUH), a component of NULM, a Project Sanction Committee shall be constituted at the State level under the Chairmanship of Principal Secretary/Secretary in-charge of NULM with representatives of all concerned departments in the State for consideration and approval of proposals submitted by ULBs/SULM (State Urban Livelihoods Mission) under SUH component of NULM. A representative of the Ministry of HUPA shall be a member of this Sanctioning Committee.

- 2. In this regard, this Ministry has decided that a HUDCO officer posted in the regional offices of the State may participate on behalf of this Ministry in the meetings of the Project Sanction Committee constituted by the States & UTs.
- 3. The officer participating in the meeting is required to give his views on the basis of the operational guidelines of Scheme of Shelters for Urban Homeless (SUH) as available on website www.nulm.gov.in, while considering the project proposals. A few of these are given below for ready reference:
 - i. The shelters under SUH would be established by the State/ULBs and operated either by them or through agencies identified by the State or ULBs. Convergence/ dovetailing of this scheme with similar programmes for urban homeless being implemented by States/UTs will be permissible.
 - ii. ULB will be required to submit proposal for construction and management of shelters with Proposed Date of Completion (PDCs), other timelines and costing details.

- For construction of new shelters, it will be responsibility of the State iii. Government/ULB to bring in the land. All the necessary clearances and approvals for the land must be obtained prior to preparation of the proposal. The cost of the land acquisition is not eligible for funding under the scheme.
- For construction of new shelters, the current Central PWD rates applicable to iv. the region/State Schedule of Rates (SOR) where construction is proposed will be applicable.

The proposals should be accompanied by a Detailed Project Report (DPR) ٠٧. with all administrative and regulatory clearances.

For refurbishment of existing structures, the necessary approval, lease νi. agreement, ownership deed and such necessary documents need to be submitted with the project proposal.

The proposal should also contain shelter management mechanism including vii. details of the staff, construction, roles and responsibility of SMC, facilities/ amenities being provided at the shelter, operational mechanism, Code of Conduct for the staff and residents, responsibilities of the shelter inmates, Delegation of Power to manage/ operate the shelter, etc. The Project should also clearly state the process to be adopted for sustaining the shelter after 5 years of operation with indicative source of funding support for operations and management of the shelter.

Mechanism for handing over assets created and its operations and νiii. maintenance should be clearly delineated before submission of a proposal by the ULB.

- It is therefore requested that orders may be issued to nominate HUDCO officers posted in various regional offices to participate in the meetings of the Project Sanction Committee of the States & UTs on behalf of this Ministry. He may also send report of such meetings to her.
