Shri Kamal Nath, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, launched 'E-Sawari' services at Indore. Loans were provided to 100 women trained under the Mission for E-Rickshaw as part of the Self Employment Programme.



Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary, MoHUA inaugurated the consultative workshop on DAY-NULM Pakhwada - "Shehri Samriddhi Utsav 2020" at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi on December 30, 2019. The workshop focused on taking learnings from the first edition of the SSU 2019 and formulating the strategy and roadmap for the coming edition of SSU 2020, which will be organized from March 28 to April 12, 2020. Collaboration with Flipkart was also formalized during the workshop through an MoU for on-boarding of high-quality products made by Self-Help Groups (SHGs) on the e-commerce portal. The awardee States of SPARK 2019 - Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh and Arunachal Pradesh were also felicitated during the workshop.

Shri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha launched the 'Jalasathi' programme on December 18, 2019 at Bhubaneshwar. On the occasion, the Water Corporation of Odisha (WATCO) signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the urban women SHG federations for implementation of the programme.





Shri Jaivardhan Singh, Hon'ble UD&HD Minister of Madhya Pradesh, inaugurated Aajivika mela at Bhopal on December 17, 2019. At the event, Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary, MoHUA launched the website plasticfreecity.org. The event was held in 51 districts of the State during which a total of 1,049 SHGs received revolving fund, loans were provided to 1,926 beneficiaries, certificates were distributed to 3,726 trained candidates and identity cards were provided to 3,198 street vendors. Over 35 SHGs participated and displayed their hand-made products in the exhibitions organized in various locations.

A City Livelihood Centre (CLC) was inaugurated at Tezu town in Arunachal Pradesh by the District Collector on December 17, 2019.





A financial literacy and counseling camp for Self-Help Groups was organized at Solan, Himachal Pradesh on December 16, 2019 in association with the Securities and Exchange Board of India.

Winter mobilisation drives for urban homeless were taken up in the States of Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Telangana. Additional temporary shelters were also established to accommodate the urban homeless in major cities.





A health check-up camp was organized for SHG members at Visakhapatnam on December 21, 2019 in association with the Mahatma Gandhi Cancer Hospital. About 200 SHG members underwent free cancer screening tests during the event.

The process for election of members for the Town Vending Committee was conducted in Hubli – Dharwad, Karnataka on December 21, 2019. A total of 2,642 street vendors casted their votes for 9 positions in the Committee.





A newly constructed 50 bedded Shelter for Urban Homeless was inaugurated on December 21, 2019 at Katihar, Bihar.

A three day training programme on Recognition of Prior Learning with a focus on health and hygiene was held for street vendors in Deoghar, Jharkhand during December 26-28, 2019
