Assam's Self-Help Groups Lead the Way in Electoral Participation

In a remarkable display of civic engagement, the Chief Electoral Office (CEO) of Assam, in collaboration with the Assam State Urban Livelihoods Mission and Assam State Rural Livelihoods Mission, achieved a significant milestone in promoting electoral participation among women. A total of 44 lakh women from Self Help Groups (SHGs) across the state of Assam participated in the initiative and took the pledge of the Election Commission of India to enhance electoral participation not only in terms of numbers but also quality through the effective implementation of Systematic Voters' Education & Electoral Participation (SVEEP), making the event enlisted in the India Book of Records. This initiative reflects the commitment of the people of Assam toward strengthening democratic processes and fostering inclusive governance.



Taufiq's Journey: How PM SVANidhi Revived a Family Business



Taufiq Mahboob Guradi, an entrepreneur from Sangli, Maharashtra, with a family tradition in the fast-food business, faced adversity when the business had to close due to the impact of COVID-19.

This closure significantly affected the family's financial situation, necessitating capital to revive the business. Discovering a ray of hope in the PM SVANidhi scheme, which offered a loan of Rs. 10,000, Taufiq immediately filled out the online form. Within a short period, the loan was disbursed, enabling him to restart his business successfully. Encouraged by the positive outcome, Taufiq applied for another loan of Rs. 20,000 under the scheme. Additionally, he availed benefits such as Life Insurance through the 'SVANidhi Se Samriddhi' scheme (which is implemented in convergence with eight welfare schemes) at a bankorganized camp. Taufiq has been ever grateful for the invaluable assistance received from the Urban Local Body staff throughout the process.

Founded by members of the Area Level Federation in the Alair Municipality, Telangana, the association is committed to transforming discarded materials into eco-friendly products. With support from DAY-NULM, they have received training and resources to craft their products. Their collaboration with the Yadadri Laxmi Narasimha Swamy Temple is especially remarkable, as they use temple offerings to create organic incense sticks. These organic sticks are made using flowers, coconut shell powders, cow dung, Tulsi oil, and other aroma oils. Additionally, they produce eco-friendly pens and pencils made from recycled newspapers, which stand as a testament to their innovation and dedication to reducing waste.


