

# **Preparatory meeting for National Roll** out of Interest Subvention Portal

A meeting was organized on August 3, 2018 under the chairmanship of Sanjay Kumar, Joint Secretary (NULM) with States & Banks to assess the preparedness for National Roll of Interest Subvention Web Portal. # **FSSM related RPL training for** sanitation workers - Case of Odisha

In order to recognize and enhance the skills of sanitation workers, the Technical Support Unit (TSU) deployed by Urban Management Centre (UMC), Ahmedabad has initiated Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) training programs on FSSM related activities.

The TSU has prepared training material on FSSM and conducted a Training of Trainers (ToT) on August 11, 2018 for INNODUST, a training agency which shall conduct the RPL for the first batch of 50 participants from August 20 -24, 2018. The initiative is being undertaken in collaboration with Sector Council Green Jobs (SCGJ), SULM Odisha and **Dhenkanal Municipality.**

#### From the States

**Guiarat:** 450 street vendors were trained on topics related to sanitation, hygiene, personal traffic rules, rules & regulation of vendors and soft skill training during a workshop organised on August 4, 2018 by Vadodara Municipal Corporation. detailed Α checklist for maintaining cleanliness and personal hygiene was also provided to the vendors during the training.

Bihar: A five day workshop for operation & maintenance Shelters for Urban Homeless (SUH) organised at Rajgir, Nalanda to enable the SHG members to run the shelters located in Ramchandarpur under the Municipal Corporation Biharsharif. Participants from 12 SHGs were trained in cooking, hospitality and cleanliness as per their area of interest. Participants were also sensitised on taking care of health & hygiene of inmates.

Andhra Pradesh: One day training on book-keeping and financial management was organised for the resource persons of Area Level Federations who will in turn train the SHG members.

#### 500 candidates to be trained under the PPP mode in Rajasthan



SULM Rajasthan has signed an Memorandum Understanding (MoU) in Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode with Gita Mittal Foundation to provide skill training and placement to 500 under EST&P youth component.

Under the MoU, the foundation has agreed to provide training through its training centres in Jaipur, Churu and Rajgarh and will bear 40% of the training cost. The remaining cost will be borne by SULM under the skilling component.
